## Native American Voting Protections

### Background

Native Americans often face additional obstacles to voting, due to geographic challenges, lack of access to mail and government services, and a history of voter suppression, among other factors. A small number of states have implemented laws specifically designed to address and mitigate these obstacles.

- California enacted [AB 2314](#) in 2020, requiring the establishment of a Native American Voting Accessibility Advisory Committee to advise the Secretary of State. The Committee is required to recommend policies to make election materials more accessible, improve voter services for Native Americans, and train poll workers to better assist Native American voters, among other issues.



#### Colorado (1)

- Colorado enacted [HB 1278](#) in 2019, which allows voters living on Indian reservations to register to vote using residences not recognized by the postal service, including the address of a tribal council headquarters.
- Colorado also enacted [SB 276](#) in 2023, which established new provisions facilitating voter registration through Tribe authorities and allows more in-person voting on Tribe lands.
